Curriculum Plans for Parents

## **English**

Poetry – I AM CAT
We will be looking at linguistic devices
and the purpose of writing.

Harry Potter theme Looking at formal writing, using a range of punctuation and clauses.

Newspaper writing - focusing on adverbials and expanded noun phrases.

Ongoing grammar, punctuation and spelling skills and handwriting practice and daily reading comprehension skills.

#### Music

We will be listening to a range of classical music styles, paying particular focus to the instruments that are used.

#### **Maths**

- Fractions, decimals and percentages
- Angles
- Co-ordinates and transformations
- Symmetry, rotations and reflection
- Reasoning skills involving all of the above

We will also have daily arithmetic including the four operations and a review of mental calculation strategies.

## Science: Light

Children will learn that light travels in straight lines and how shadows are formed. Children will investigate how objects are seen due to reflection of light into the eye.

**Reading**: Throughout Key Stage 2, children should continue to read on a nightly basis, this can be independently or with an adult; this will help to improve their comprehension skills and widen their vocabulary.

**Spelling:** Each week children are set spellings matched to their ability. Words should be practised frequently.

*Maths:* All children are expected to know their times tables, up to and including 12x12.

**General support for other subjects:** You can help your child in all subjects by looking at reference books from the library or using the internet to find out further information. Parents and carers can also be very valuable resources. If you can offer any knowledge, expertise or examples of artefacts related to our topics this term, please see your child's teacher.
